

Much like our more traditional first responders (fire, police, medical), our line crews go unnoticed until they are needed.

Linemen are a great example of service before self, and exemplify some of the best qualities of the cooperative's commitment to community. It takes all types of people doing all types of jobs across the nation's cooperative network to keep the lights on for rural America, but the lineman position is a common bond between the over 68,000 people employed by cooperatives nationally.

I am the proud father of one of these linemen. My son Tyson lives in Bismarck, ND, and works for an electrical utility there. When my son was little, he was always around line crews and was enamored with the "big trucks" as he used to say. He decided to become a lineman just out of high school, and I could not have been more proud.

The cooperative network is great place for people to work. In addition to the lineman positions, there are great technical and administrative positions like engineers, accountants, specialists in member service, information technology, communications and marketing, and other general business positions. Working at a cooperative is a great choice and can lead to a very fulfilling career.

PRECorp's team is 125 people strong and our team is passionate about serving you and working together to keep the lights on in northeast Wyoming. Keeping a system of over 100,000 poles that creates a network of 10,000 miles of line covering 15,000 square miles is no small task. The PRECorp team is in a constant mode of maintaining, operating, and constructing so that our system delivers cost-effective and reliable energy services, no matter what.

Good weather, bad weather, day or night, the entire PRECorp team is here to serve you and to help maintain the quality of life electricity brings to towns and our rural areas. 
